Pilot Program for Standards Development

To reduce the time to publication and ensure more consistent document development timelines, CLSI is launching a pilot program for standards development. The program requires DDCs to:

- Set a project-specific timeline and milestones for activities from the time of project approval through preparation of the Proposed Draft for vote.
- Establish a customized Web conference schedule at the face-to-face meeting (for the time period up to completion of the Proposed Draft) to meet document development needs.

In addition, the pilot program will:

- Introduce an Administrative Vice-Chairholder position with identified roles and responsibilities.
- Implement a quarterly reporting schedule to communicate document development successes and challenges to the Consensus Council.

Finally, a technical writer may be made available to assist in drafting document content.

The following projects have been identified to participate in this pilot program:

- EP26: User Evaluation of Between-Reagent Lot Variation
- EP27: How to Construct and Interpret an Error Grid for Quantitative Diagnostic Assays
- NBS06: Newborn Screening for Severe Combined Immunodeficiency and Other Related Severe Immunodeficiencies
- QMS15: Assessments: Laboratory Internal Audit Program

Lessons learned from these pilot projects will be used to improve the next generation of the CLSI document development process.
